

### Why are we here?

- House Bill 3115 (2021) provides that local law regulating sitting, lying, sleeping or keeping warm and dry outdoors on public property that is open to public must be <u>objectively reasonable</u> as to time, place, and manner with regards to persons experiencing homelessness
- Hillsboro Municipal Codes need to be update in light of recent court decisions and HB 3115
- We are currently in a "housing crisis" with limited access to affordable housing options
- Collaboration and partnership are essential to addressing this issue with compassion
- Community input is important for council when making policy decisions that will impact our community
- Using a collaborative process to build consensus creates a deeper understanding of the issue and reinforces the importance of relationships within community
