Making a Safe Home for Our Birds

- Birds are welcome members of our community.
- They are good company, fun, and beautiful and we all want to keep them safe.
- They are part of a healthy garden ecosystem and eat a massive quantity of insects and harmful grubs and slugs.
- Raptors help control mice, rats, voles, and moles.





Bird Friendly Trellises





For the Birds - Safe Trellising

- Best if trellises are one foot above the ground.
- No taller than 5 feet.
- Trellis openings should be 3 inches or more.
- Netting used for trellises needs approval.
- Trellis netting must be stretched tight and not allowed to sag.





Bird Friendly Trellises





For the Birds – Being Very Careful

- Take care in selecting the materials for your trellis.
- String netting is problematic and can easily lead to a terrible death.
- Using rigid materials will safeguard birds and cannot sag or tangle.
- Openings of 3 inches or more allow birds to fly or jump through.



Bird Friendly Trellises




For the Safety of Our Garden Birds

- You can be very creative and bird friendly at the same time!



















String is tight. If it gets loose, it could catch a bird.
























Bird-Safe Netting: Keeping Birds Off!



Pick the Right Netting

Use the 'finger test' - choose netting that you cannot poke your finger through. The mesh size should be less than 5 mm.

- Tulle netting or Organza keeps birds off bushes.
 - Get at Joann Fabrics, Amazon
 - Use tulle bags for individual fruit
 - Use a huge swath of netting for the whole bush.
