HEALTH, WELLNESS & SAFETY

Fire Rescue 1 goes into service — a medic transport unit staffed by firefighter paramedics.

Hiring will begin for up to 15 new firefighters ahead of the future construction of a new fire station in the South Hillsboro neighborhood.



New **electric vehicles** will join the City's fleet.

ECONOMY AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Community Development Code amendments will refine standards on short-term rentals, food trucks, open space, and undergrounding of overhead utilities.

Construction will continue on **14 projects** for the **Willamette Water Supply System**.

The grand opening of Nueva Esperanza, a new affordable housing development, is expected in 2023.



Completing the **2022-2023 Housing Needs Analysis** will guide decision-making and housing policies to meet the future housing needs of Hillsboro's diverse community.

An **expanded fleet shop** will service more City vehicles.

Work will continue on the sanitary master plan to guide the next decade of **infrastructure investments** in our sanitary sewer system.

LIVABILITY and recreation



A new art piece, **Bridge of Land and Sky**, will grace both sides of the Brookwood Overpass over US 26. Completion is expected by February.

Wapato Woman will be installed at Rood Bridge Park and Tualatin River access.



The grand opening of Hillsboro's first Inclusive Park & Playground is expected in late 2023.

The Burger Family @ SHARC will be **refurbished**.

Expanded Parks & Recreation programming at M&M Marketplace includes a new mural & events.

In the South Hillsboro neighborhood, a **second park** will open in the Reed's Crossing development and Butternut Creek Park will **expand**.

La Strada dei Pastelli Chalk Art Festival will return to Downtown Hillsboro for its second year.

Development of a **Parks & Recreation System Plan** will continue to help identify community priorities for amenities and services.
