3. Communication and Non-Agenda Items



3.1 Directives Report – presented by Tacy Steele

- 1. Total FY 2023-24 HUB Assistance helped 595 customers with foregone revenue of \$44,081 in water revenue and \$112,500 in total. The City Manager gave approval for revenue foregone to exceed the original cap of \$100,000.
- 2. July 2024 has surpassed July 2023 with 61 unique customers served, compared to 26. Water revenue foregone is at \$6650 for Water and \$15,145 total, compared to \$1928 and \$4912 in 2023.
- 3. A 2nd Annual Community Partner Appreciation Lunch and Engagement Session was held on July 24, with attendees from all three partners in attendance. Updates were provided by City Departments, Utility Assistance Billing Changes were presented, and next steps and communication tools were discussed in a group roundtable.

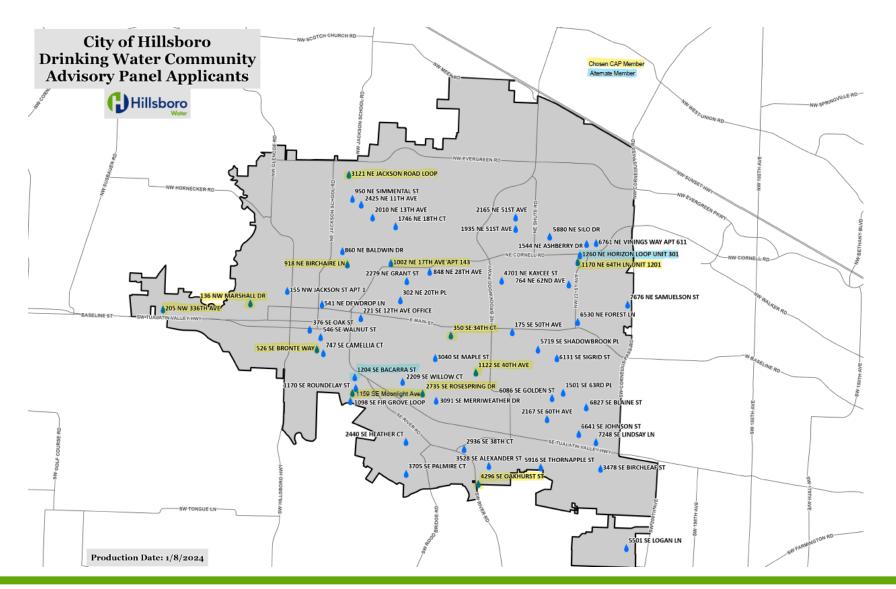


Extensive outreach paid off with 58 eligible applicants.

- Water's most successful solicitation for public participation.
- We included an offer to help with transportation and babysitting costs if needed.
- We paid a cash stipend to ensure that applicants wouldn't have to choose between work or CAP participation.

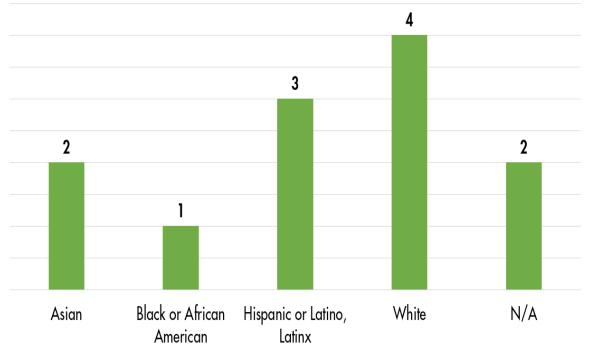


12 selected for CAP. Highlighted to show overall geographic coverage.

The 12 panelists included renters, homeowners, condo owners, single parent, and other factors.

We achieved our goal of a diverse group.

Key Points for the CAP:

- ✓ Pilot in 2025 and 2026.
- ✓ 6.5% overall revenue adjustment.
- ✓ Incorporate incremental changes.
- ✓ Integrate into City's existing billing systems.

Status Quo defined as applying rate adjustment with no changes to rate design.

CAP members reviewed data and asked for follow up data. Members drilled down into details before making their decisions.





2024 Water Community Advisory Panel

Met five times for about two to three hours per meeting.

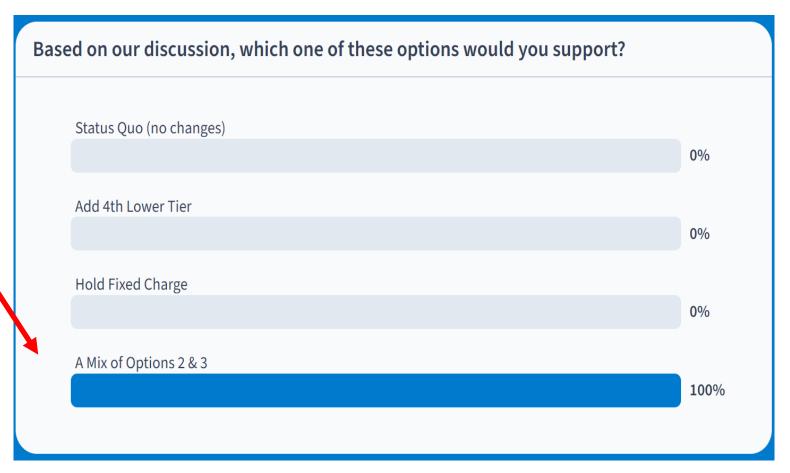
Community Advisory Panel (CAP) Recommendations



We used a real-time phone survey for CAP to vote on options.

Single Family:

- Add a fourth rate tier.
- Holding base charge flat.
- Helps low volume customers like retirees, but all customers will get low rate.

• Single Family Residential includes single homes, duplexes and triplexes. This also includes a garage converted into small apartment, and similar residential infill.

- \$21.94 base rate is the lowest base rate in Hillsboro's Water Rate Schedule.
- Block 1 is <u>lowest</u> retail volume rate and block 2 is second lowest. For contrast, Industrial volume rate is \$4.75/ccf.
- All residential customers benefit from this rate for their first 8 ccf per month.

Multi-Family:

CAP reviewed the current rate structure with winter and summer rates and the impacts of reverting back to a single Multi-Family volume rate.

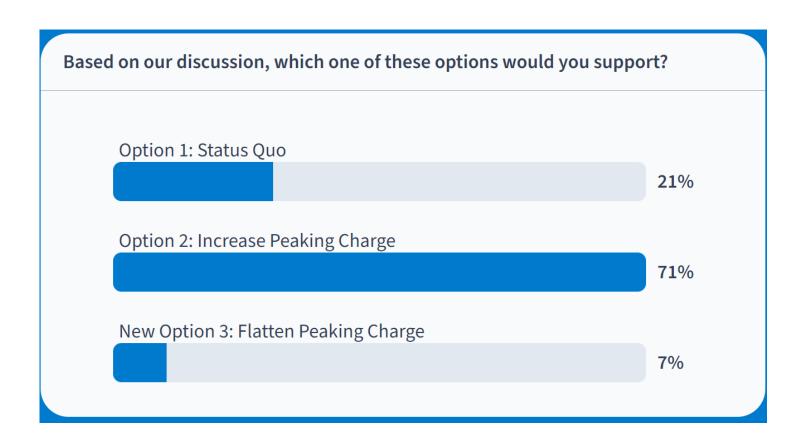
- Top ten lowest peaking accounts would see 1.8% increase plus the rate adjustment.
- Top ten highest peaking accounts
 would see 2.5% reduction.
- Goes against conservation goals.
- CAP prioritized conservation.

Community Advisory Panel (CAP) Recommendations



Here is the CAP vote on Multi-Family options:

- Reduced the winter rate.
- Increase the *usage over* winter (summer) rate.
- Encourage conservation.
- Helps customers will low summer peaking.

CAP recommended a lower adjustment for Winter Volume and then a higher increase for Usage over Winter (peak summer usage).

Winter Volume charge is adjusted by 5.0% and Usage over Winter by 12.8% to reach overall 6.5% revenue adjustment.

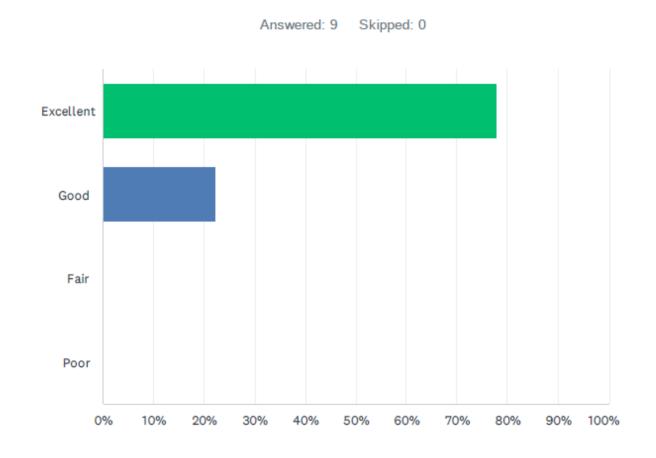
The change will be gradually implemented for two years.

Background – 2021 Presentation



This slide assumes there was <u>no deal</u> on WWSS negotiations on project deferrals.

- Increased WTP construction cost to \$268M, and overall WWSP cost increase of \$315M.
- Even with project deferrals, we were still anticipating approximately <u>9.5% to 10.5%</u> rate increases for the six-year period.

2024 Preliminary Rate Study Results



Draft Rate Model Results:

- Overall rate adjustments from 4.0% to 6.5% over next six years.
- Cash balances decrease to about \$33M by 2026 as WWSP is completed.
- All \$251M WIFIA loan is drawn down.
- Potential need for a new \$35M revenue bond, has varied from \$35M to about \$60M.
- SDCs help keep rates more affordable; Growth pays for growth.

- UC direction was to implement rates aligned with Cost of Service Analysis.
- UC Goal was to allow for more moderate rate changes by next rate study.
- Irrigation was low for many years, which made catch up harder.
- UC smoothed year 3
 Irrigation in response to public comment.

Cost of Service Study:

- 6.5% or less: revenue estimate aligned with cost estimate.
- Above 6.5%: revenue estimate fell below cost estimate.
- UC direction is to phase in over two years.
- These are typical/averages, so individual bills may differ.

In October, UC will consider approving 2025 and 2026 rate proposal.

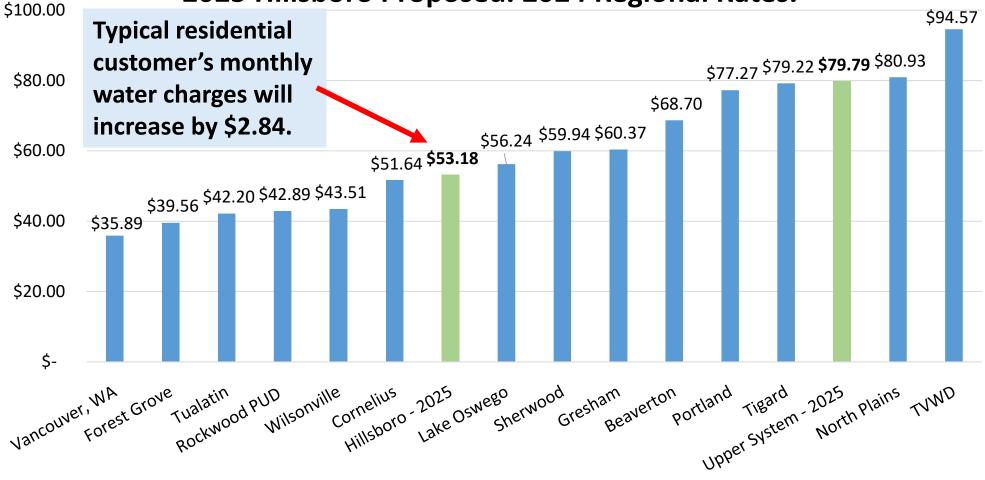

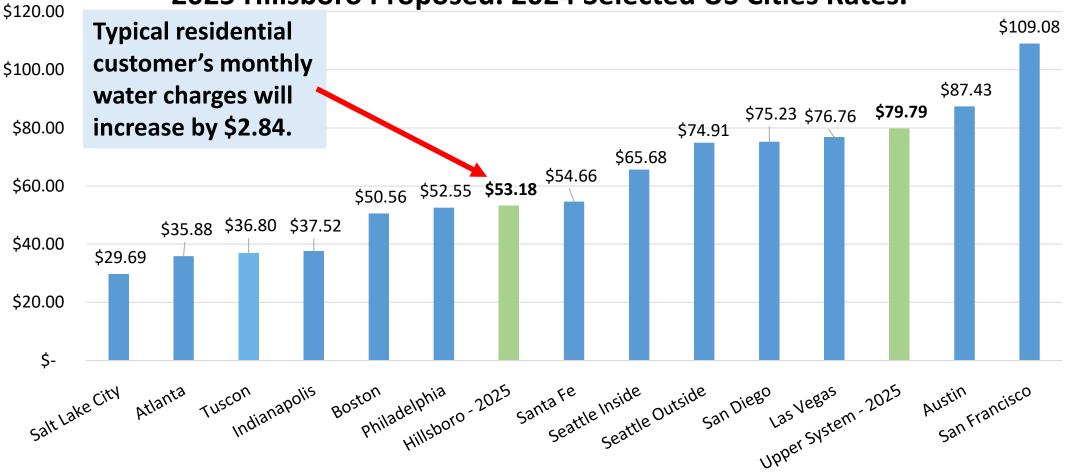
Regional Comparison of Typical Residential Water Charges 2025 Hillsboro Proposed. 2024 Regional Rates.

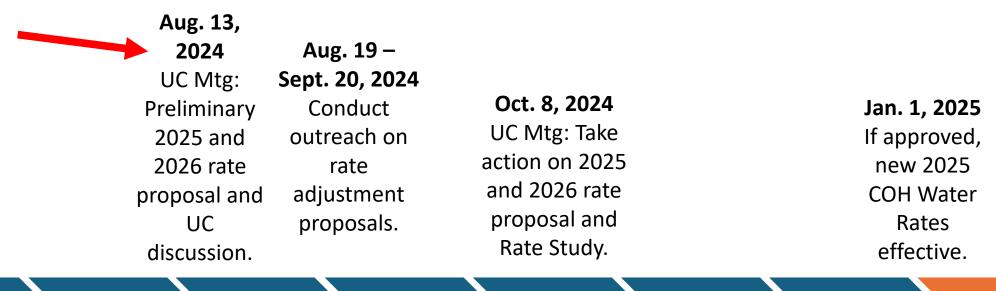

- \$35 million new debt bond in the Rate Model.
- This has been very consistent as we have updated the model ranging from \$35M to about \$60M.
- Monitoring cash balances/burn rate for timing a new bond. Watching for rates to drop.
- Resolution includes new language for temporary meters.

Monthly Financial Status Report



- ✓ Close of the 12th Month of the Fiscal Year 2023-2024.
- ✓ Water Charges for Services Revenues are at an estimated \$50.6 million and tracking higher than last fiscal year for the period.
- ✓ Water SDC Revenues are at \$9.6 million. We continue to keep the SDC revenue projection low due to the year-to-year volatility.
- ✓ Expenditures came in below budget as expected.
- ✓ Water demand water produced is at the 3rd highest, when compared to data from 2018 to 2022.
